JAPANESE soft sculpture artist Masami Water installation is on display at the Cleveland Living Arts Centre. Shoes must be removed before entering, which helps the viewer to engage more fully with the sensory experience

Masami is attempting to provoke, and might well refer to the Japanese cultural norm of removing one's shoes before entering a house. The walls are draped with fabric ribbons baring different black lines and swirls, which evoke the movement of water.

Participants in this interactive work are invited to choose their own drop of water, wrapped in tinfoil and scattered around the room and, in return, leave their impression of a water drop in the space as they depart. The water drops contain a surprise and are to be opened outside.

The miracles of the universe are Masami's inspiration. There is something innately appealing about being asked to participate in the creation of an artwork.
